

Today there are 40 theaters in New York City that are known as Broadway theaters. Surprisingly, only three of these are on the street called "Broadway." All the others are on other streets in and around Times Square. These are big theaters with 500 seats or more. Of course, New York City has smaller theaters, too. "Off Broadway" theaters have fewer than 500 seats, and "off off Broadway" theaters have fewer than 100 seats.

Tickets for Broadway plays aren't cheap. They can cost \$140 or more. But there are ways to see a Broadway play more cheaply. For example, early afternoon shows (matinees) usually cost less than evening shows, and seats in the back of the theater are cheaper than seats that are closer to the stage. To save the most money, you can buy a "Standing Room Only" ticket. You'll have to stand at the back of the theater, so remember to wear comfortable shoes!

New York has Broadway, and London has the West End. Last year, Broadway theaters sold about 12.27 million tickets, while West End theaters sold about 13.6 million. *The Phantom of the Opera* is Broadway's longest-running show. It opened in 1988 and has been performed more than 9,500 times. In comparison, the West End's *The Mousetrap* opened in 1958 and has been performed more than 24,000 times.
